



APSS MEDTRONIC FELLOWSHIP 2015 19 August 2015 – 19 August 2016

On behalf of APSS, I am pleased to present the report of the APSS Medtronic Fellowship 2015. This fellowship programme marked the first fellowship programme jointly held by APSS and Medtronic. Four (4) fellowships were awarded in the programme, in which each fellow was attached and spent a duration of 3 months in a spine centre of excellence in the Asia Pacific Region. Out of the four awards, three awards were given to applicants from developing countries. The fellowship programme was held successfully between 19 August 2015 and 19 August 2016.

To be able to qualify for this fellowship programme, an applicant must comply with the list of criteria as listed in the programme. One of the pre-requisites is that the applicant must be a member of APOA and APSS and practicing in spine surgery. Economy air travel, hotel accommodation and allowance arrangements were provided to these successful candidates. Upon the completion of the programme, the fellows were required to submit a report and a feedback form before they were allowed to claim their allowance.
